Monthly community car seat checkup events are hosted throughout the county to provide caregivers with hands-on education with certified CPSTs (child passenger safety technicians) on the installation of their car seat.

**Venice Family Clinic** offer primary and specialty medical care, mental health care, dental care, vision services, substance use treatment, domestic violence counseling, HIV services, healthy food distributions, health education, health insurance enrollment, child development services and more.
